
We wish each of our SVD Lay Partners around the world a beautiful experience of Christmas. May the miracle of Bethlehem touch us. Merry Christmas!!

My experience at the Workshop for Lay Partners

Hello, I'm Mariana Flores, a member of the Lay Missionaries of the Divine Word (MLVD in Riverside, CA) for 11 years now and my experience in the Nemi Workshop was very profound and encouraging. It was wonderful to witness and share how from different parts of the world, we the laity, are part of this great mission and spirituality of St. Arnold Janssen. Each of the presenters had a wealth of experience and knowledge to share with us.

A few of my personal highlights were: 1) Fr. Stanislaus Lazar, SVD motivating us to recognize that it is God's Mission and our responsibility to preach the Good News and to put it into practice 2) Fr. Jose Antunes, SVD teaching us about the correct attitudes of Mutual Respect, Humility, Fidelity and Openness for a Prophetic Dialogue and encouraging us to "develop our Right to be missionaries." 3) Fr. Arlindo Diaz, SVD emphasizing the SVD Mission, identity and presence in the world.



We had great presentations affirming the four characteristic dimensions of the congregation: Communication, JPIC, Mission Animation and Bible Apostolate. But I must confess, my favorite workshops were: 1st the presentation on Arnoldus Spirituality given d by Fr. CHILE: Experience that Speaks

MISSIONARY TESTIMONY: "Send me, Lord!" I am Luisa Oyarzún, an active lay woman at San Cayetano Parish. During the month of November, I was able to live one of the most beautiful and rewarding experiences for any layperson; which is to share and live the mission, crossing our borders. The Lord invited us to share our faith with our brothers and sister in El Salvador and Guatemala. It was an unforgettable experience! In El Salvador beyond the guerrillas, we met very friendly people and above all protective; there



were many gangs, but also communities with much religious preparation and biblical studies. The youth know much of their history and when foreigners come, they study the history of the visitor. It is a country of many martyrs Archbishop Romero, Rutilio Grande and many children; there have been communities massacred in their Churches; there are five thousand inhabitants in the country and two thousand who had to flee the country. They protect the sea and its products from its largest predator: the human being and the garbage they waste. We were involved in the release of recently hatched turtles, which was exciting. In Guatemala we experienced poverty firsthand, surviving with those who have nothing, who are marginalized by the wealthy, with those who work today in order to eat tomorrow; within such poverty, they go out of their homes to surrender it to the missionaries.

MISSIONARY TESTIMONY: "Available for God": my name is Patricia Lizana Quezada and I am a single mom. At this time, I serve the Lord in the community of Saint Matthias the Apostle in Holy Spirit Parish in El Pinar. I am part of the spirituality team of the Southern Vicariate. Today, I can clearly see all I have lived has allowed me to be here witnessing my service to the Lord in this Missionary Church we are all part of today. Many, many years ago, the Christian Cursillo Movement, recorded in my heart a special key phrase "Evangelize in all places, when it is convenient and inconvenient". And such is how, with the grace of God, my life began the path of conscious transformation. My desire to search for God deepened every day, as I discovered everything led me to be of service to others. Then suddenly I found myself serving: in the Claretian school where my son attended, at my work site in the Bank, I formed part of pastoral banking and pastoral workers team, in the prison of San Miguel I was part of prison Ministry and Juvenile Hall as well as in the hospital Barros Luco, as part of volunteering for Caritas Chile. Obviously, every service in its own time. Today, I am under the auspices of the SVD Missionaries, from whom I have learned the great love of our one triune God and also that "The Word" is always at the Center. Just as its founder St Arnold Janssen on one occasion said, "The most sublime expression of love for each other is to announce the Gospel". Under this beautiful motto, I was also formed in my early days as part of the group Alma Verbita, a group of lay missionaries at the service of the mission, for which I had to take a step aside as a result of new ways of service to the Lord. For me, it is amazing to discover how the Lord is daily opening new missionary opportunities for me. As any mortal human being, on more than one occasion,



I have felt the desire to leave when faced with difficulties. Yet, here I am. If it is the will of God, everything continues. Today I give my service as a spiritual companion and accompany others living Ignatian retreats. It once again leads me to discover the suffering Christ present in each one of the people who I accompany, as well as to also discover the hunger and enormous need which exists in today's society: which is to find and discover that "something more", which certainly is the presence of God in their lives. Through the years of service to the Lord, I have also discovered constant training is vital because without it, I can hardly continue to know the historical Jesus and the risen Christ present in the world today. As a sign of this, I am completing a course of study in the spiritual exercises of St. Ignatius. In closing of this testimony, I can only say "Thank you Lord!" for loving me and give me this deep desire for You.

DEMOCRATIC REPUBLIC OF THE CONGO (DRC)

A child affected by the violence in Kasaï

Have you ever let tears roll down your cheeks while listening to a child talk? For me, that happened a few weeks ago, when I met Justine. (*name changed for privacy*).

"It was around midday when panic broke out in our little village. My father spoke to me, my sister and my two little brothers. "We can't save ourselves with you four..". I no longer heard what he said, and I begged my father not



to abandon us. Before closing the door and leaving with my mother, he prayed to God to keep us safe. From the inside our house I could see huts of our neighbours on fire. We had to save ourselves! We left through the window with people who were fleeing. We slept in the forests under the stars. I haven't heard any news of my parents, my sister and my two little brothers."

Justine is not an isolated case – many thousands of displaced children in Kasaï need humanitarian assistance in the Kwilu and Kwango provinces. For one year, crisis has raged in the Kasaï region, in the Democratic Republic of the Congo (DRC). The conflicts between the Kamwina Nsapu militia and the security forces have made Kasaï a region with one of the highest number of internally displaced people, among them, thousands of children. Justine, a young girl of 15, is one of these children. UNICEF supports getting children back into school in the region of Grand Kasaï through outreach programmes.

Glimpses of St. Arnold's Spirituality

Prayer life

As a boy of 15, I entered the SVD Mission House, Marienburg, Switzerland. I am grateful to the Society of the Divine Word that has led me to a habit of prayer; morning, midday and evening prayer, Quarter-hour-prayer, singing in the choir, singing the Gregorian-Chant and Holy Eucharist. Today, a *Kyrie*, a *Veni Sancte Spiritus*, or *the Our Father* is so often on my lips.

Worldwide SVD family

From 1962 to 1965, many missionaries – brothers, priests and bishops – from all over the world visited Marienburg. They told about their life and their missionary work. Swiss missionaries were sent out to other countries with the *Ave Maris Stella* (*Marian hymn – Hail, Star of the Sea*). These were my first experiences with the global world.

With trust in God, courage and openness and with the inspiration of Arnold Janssen, the Divine Word missionaries reached out to all nations – "*Make disciples of all nations*! " (Mt.28.19). I experience the same wonderful SVD family today, especially in the Workshop for SVD Lay Partners in Nemi, in the community at the SVD Generalate in Rome, and of course in our Freundeskreis, Switzerland!

One hair

Each community has its troubles and conflicts. All our fears, wishes, expectations, worries and influences hunt us, and sadden us. The Mass on St. Arnold Janssen's feast day in 1969 gave me a motto for my life: No matter how bad it is, just improve it by one hair! Like St. Arnold, go on step by step and God is always with you.

Testimony of life

Missionary work starts not with words but by our testimony of life. I remember Pope Paul VI's Evangelii Nuntiandi (1975): "Above all, the Gospel must be proclaimed by witness. ... Through this wordless witness these Christians stir up irresistible questions in the hearts of those who see how they live: Why are they like this? Why do they live in this way? What or who is it that inspires them?" (No.21). The marvelous testimonies of all the groups at the Workshop for the SVD Lay Partners, their activities, their reaching out to the



poor and the marginalized brought me back again to ask and to reflect.

Remain in me, as I remain in you (John 15.4)

How true! Again and again, I listen to his Word, listen into my heart, into the events of my daily life, into the hearts of the others, into the silence of the tremendous powerful universe, into the depth of all depths, as St. Arnold and all the other Saints did.

How beautiful to belong to the SVD Family!

The first workshop for SVD Lay Partners took place in the *Ad Gentes Center* in Nemi, Rome from October 14 to 29, 2017. Twenty seven persons from very different countries, such as: Mexico, Chile, Poland, South Africa, USA, the Philippines, Paraguay, Spain, India, Angola, Kenya, Ghana, Germany, Congo, Switzerland and Panama (16 countries), representing 18 lay partners groups, participated in this workshop. We received a very warm and hospitable welcome from the local community. The moderators, Fr. Stanislaus Lazar, SVD and Fr. Tim Norton, SVD, made sure that we could feel good and at home at all times.

The main objectives of the workshop were:

- To promote greater participation of the laity in the missionary activities of the SVD.
- To have a deeper knowledge of the spirituality, mission and roots of the SVD worldwide and of its groups of lay missionaries.
- To have a more personal knowledge of our lay co-workers with a view to a greater commitment and mutual collaboration in the future.
- To be more committed to collaborate with one another and design an Action Plan of lay partners.

The workshop was opened with the enthronement of the Word, followed by a general vision of the workshop. Then Fr. Heinz Kulüke, Superior General, presided at the joyous inaugural celebration of the Eucharist; his homily – bilingual and with many "knowing winks" – emphasized the fact that one of the most important characteristics of the SVD is its work with lay groups, whom we do not consider as simple "collaborators" but as true "sharers of responsibility" in the Mission. The presence of the Superior General was a testimony to the personal conviction and commitment he has towards all of us. This workshop is a clear manifestation of how the Society puts great value in all the initiatives and work that the lay partners have been doing in carrying out the SVD's vision through the years. More importantly, it wants to solidify this partnership and hear from the laity themselves how we can together move forward and "not to bury this treasure."

The formative part was carefully prepared and accessible to all, thanks to the team of translators in English and Spanish (Fr. Reynaldo Román, SVD, Fr. Sonny de Rivera, SVD, and Fr. Gino Jiménez, SVD). The various talks were:

- The Church, Laity and Mission (Fr. Stanislaus Lazar, SVD): Earlier and present-day role of the laity in the Church.
- Prophetic Dialogue (Fr. José Antunes da Silva, SVD): The process of discovering how God speaks to us as friends and how the notion of "mission frontiers" has evolved – mission no longer signifies going out, but rather entering into dialogue with other persons.
- The SVD in the World (Fr. Arlindo Dias, SVD): A general view of the situation of the SVD in the world, and how mission has changed. In the past, missionaries from Europe brought Jesus to America and Africa... now Jesus is already there before their arrival. Europe is today's missionary challenge.
- JPIC (Fr. Daisuke Narui, SVD): This is one of the dimensions of the SVD charism, molded
 in its love and respect for creation, for justice and peace through its ecological, political and
 social activities in the UN and VIVAT International, denouncing injustices.

- Bible Apostolate (Fr. Marek Vanus, SVD): This is another specific SVD dimension where
 we see different ways of involvement with the Word of God so as to make it the vital force
 in our own lives.
- Communications (Fr. Modeste Munimi, SVD): By virtue of being missionaries, we are
 called to communicate; we study how to dialogue, to share, to serve, and to listen according
 to the model of Divine Communication and the media at our disposal for spreading the
 Good News.
- Missionary Spirituality (Fr. Budi Kleden, SVD): Difference between spirituality and
 activism in mission; keys for working in such a way as to highlight the spiritual quality of
 our action; its characteristics and main elements; spirituality as a way of life, as the
 motivating and unifying dimension of a person.
- The Mission of the Laity in Evangelii Gaudium and Amoris Laetitia (Sr. Mary John Kudiyiruppil, SSpS): A detailed study of the two Apostolic Exhortations of Pope Francis and their symbols; how to be a living witness, both in the joyful presentation of the Gospel as well as in our family life.
- The Spirituality of St. Arnold (Fr. Tony Pates, SVD): Two sessions dedicated to the study of the spiritual and Trinitarian charism of Arnold Janssen; to understand the dynamics of "missionary mysticism", the dynamic working of the Spirit personal, communitarian and inter-communitarian and how missionary identity is built based on this model.
- Interculturality and Leadership (Fr. Tim Norton, SVD): Concepts of culture and learning; individual work to find our own personal models for conflict resolution through group dynamics.
- Group Development and Dynamics (Fr. Gregory Pinto, SVD): The concept of a team, operational problems of a group, and qualities of a good leader.
- Generating Funds for the Mission (Fr. Andrzej Danilewicz, SVD): How can provinces/ regions/missions (PRMs) generate funds for the mission as well as creative resources for funding mission projects?
- The various ways of other Congregations and laity, its organization, charisma, activities
 and challenges were presented by Lidia Rey (Lasalle), Rui Lopes and Ruth Anne Henderson
 (Dominicans), Claudio Mario Betti (San Egidio), and Arlindo Pinto (Combonian),
 presenting different visions of the same common objective to be committed agents in the
 transformation of the world.

Every day began with Morning Prayer, and language was no problem for daily celebration of the Eucharist at 12 noon – a well-chosen symbol of the centrality of God in our lives. On successive nights, the various lay partner groups presented their local groups and their missionary work with slides, PowerPoint, songs, etc., adorned with their typical costumes. Many had brought along beautiful souvenirs of their countries as gifts for the participants. We had a festive celebration of our coming together on the first and last night of the meeting, to deepen our friendship and share the joy of being together for this very special experience. During the presentations, we expressed that we cherish the gift of being SVD lay partner and all the support that we receive from the Society, but some also pointed out that at times, there is a lack of support from the confreres and a lack of getting the laity to be enthusiastic with Arnoldus spirituality. But above all, the presentations made everybody realize one beautiful and important gift as partners belonging to an international community: there is unity in diversity. We may come from different cultures and contexts but we are bonded by friendship and love and we are all moving forward toward one mission – His mission.

However, one does not live on formation alone! We had a tremendous privilege of being able to participate in an Audience with Pope Francis, in St. Peter's Square – this was a moment of great emotion, knowing that for many it would never be repeated. We were also able to visit some of Rome's most important Basilicas: St. Mary Major, St. Paul outside the walls, and St. John Lateran, strolling through their corridors, marveling at the extraordinary beauty of their architecture and the contagious spirituality they emanate. One of the emotional moments of our trip was the celebration of the Eucharist in the Catacomb of St. Domitila – it was really an invitation to meditative spiritual reflection which permeates this sacred place of pilgrimage for millions of pilgrims down through the centuries. This was followed by a brief guided tour through a section of the 12 km of passageways of the catacombs.

We then paid a visit to the SVD Generalate and the Collegio del Verbo Divino, where we were warmly welcomed by the Rector, Fr. Nicolás Espinosa, SVD and the entire community, who welcomed us with drinks and appetizers and a fraternal meal together; afterwards we still had time for a tour of the different areas of the House.

We should also mention that we travelled to Assisi, birthplace of St. Francis; we visited the Porciúncula inside the Basilica of St. Mary of the Angels and celebrated Mass in a beautiful crypt in the basement. Afterwards we walked through the streets of old Assisi, its monastery and places marked by the love and simplicity of St. Francis, preaching with love to the whole of creation.

Some of the topics discussed in our Action-Plan session were:

- What constitutes the identity of our lay members and what elements should be highlighted in their initial and on-going formation?
- How can we promote their apostolate and the international connection of their members?
- What suggestions would you like to make to the General Council with a view to improving communication and understanding between the SVD confreres and the SVD lay partners?
- How do we promote our ministry within the SVD?

During the concluding Eucharistic celebration, all participants, including Fr. Stanislaus Lazar and Fr. Tim Norton, received and wore a cross symbolizing that the bigger part of the journey has just started. The cross is a beautiful reminder for everyone – both the SVDs and the lay partners – that we need to continue "His mission".

This experience – which was profoundly multicultural – meant for all of us, as we have made manifest, a truly qualitative leap forward in our missionary life. This was evidenced both by how we were enriched by what we heard, shared and learned in the sessions, as well as by overcoming obstacles (such as language) to better understand each other, creating bonds of friendship and cooperation, not only among ourselves, but also making us feel a real and deep sense of belonging to the SVD family. Our hope is that this may be the initial step towards real communion in that calling which God makes to all of us to build up his Kingdom. There were some emotional moments too realizing the gift of God and gift of persons.

We thank sincerely the SVD Generalate to organize this workshop which was well organized with meticulous care and concern for each participant. Well, the greater responsibility is ahead – to continue as active participants in the mission.

Concluding Session

A. Challenges to the SVD Lay Partners

- 1. Promotion of SVD lay partners in a province/region/mission (PRM) or in a country; showing the way to live a lay vocation.
- Strengthening the relationship between SVD lay partners and PRM administration, mission secretary and other SVD conferes – challenges of communication, building trust and personal relationships.
- 3. Formation of SVD lay partners to know more about the Founder, charism of the Society and the duties of lay partners.
- 4. Commitment to continue the SVD charism with other lay partners and the SVD priests and brothers.
- 5. Identity of SVD lay partners and being creative in doing the mission

Suggestive Action Plan for Promotion of SVD Lay Partners

B. Promotion of SVD Lay Partners

- In the PRMs where we have SVD schools, the spirituality of St. Arnold could be included and the SVD lay partners can be spurred on to work both with the students and with the teaching staff.
- 2. In "SVD parishes", the lay members can foment a group conscience in order to be visible and have the opportunity to make themselves known and draw attention.
 - Charitable works in a parish, T-shirts, mission visits, etc.
 - Arnoldus spirituality prayers could be said in SVD parishes to increase the awareness
 of the group.
 - Each group could formulate one or two prayers or slogan that could be recited by heart
- 3. Contact SVD institutions to give a weekend session or retreat for lay partners.
- Create mission awareness in the media (radio, events, solidarity concerts, the printed word, etc.)
- 5. Prepare special programs for Founder's Day in our parishes.
- 6. Promote an apostolate in families, in such a way that all members can participate.
- 7. Make use of Facebook, Whatsapp and e-mail with a view to more personal contact and for sharing projects, guidelines, materials, advice, etc.
- 8. Create a Whatsapp group among the participants in this workshop; use it with prudence and be conscious of the motive for which it is created (avoid overloading it, as well as political or pointless commentaries).
- Participate actively and support the SVD lay partners newsletter, edited and published by Susan Noronha and Rosa Gouveia.

C. Strengthening the understanding between the SVD lay partners and the SVD confreres and promotion of SVD lay partners in the Society

 The leaders of the SVD lay partners should communicate their activities to the PRM administration. The lay partners are encouraged to maintain personal contact with SVD conferes.

D. SVD Lay Partners Identity and Formation (initial and on-going) of Lay Partners

- 11. SVD Lay Partners Identity: Every member understands and develops Christian vocation; he/she imbibes Arnoldus Spirituality, specially sustained by Trinitarian Spirituality; works with four characteristic dimensions of the SVD Mission Animation, Bible Apostolate, Communications, and Justice and Peace and the Integrity of Creation; and promotes interculturality. One should clearly avoid clericalizing them.
- 12. Each member could have a period of formation before being recognized as a member of SVD lay partner group. The period of duration could be decided by the PRM administration in consultation with the local lay partner groups. Where there are no groups, PRM administration could decide on the duration of formation.
- 13. Each PRM and its lay partner group should have a manual for lay partner formation.

The initial formation could include:

- Gaining a deeper knowledge of the life of the founding generation, their charism and their work. It is only by studying and knowing them that we will be able to integrate them in our lives as missionaries and transmit them to others.
- The history of the Society and the history and development of the PRM.
- Distinct reality of the PRM or country, its special events and transformations.
- Special orientations of the Society to the present time.

Ongoing formation could include:

- Special attention given to prayers (The Quarter Hour Prayer, the Vademecum, missionary rosaries, etc.), Prologue of Saint John, Lectio Divina, spiritual retreats, Bible workshops, prayer groups, etc.
- Study of the Social Doctrine of the Church as a basis for topics related to JPIC.
- On-going formation in the four characteristic dimensions SVD.
- 14. SVD Lay partners are in need of booklets with practical ways on the Charismatic Dimensions and Prophetic Dialogue for SVD lay partners.
