First Zonal Meeting of the SVD Lay Partners of the EUROPA Zone

Sankt Augustin (Germany), June 2025



"We are gifted to give"

From 18^{th} to 22^{nd} June, participants from the seven SVD provinces of Spain, Italy, Slovakia, Hungary, Poland, Germany and the Netherlands/Belgium came together in Sankt Augustin for the 1st zonal meeting of the SVD Lay EUROPA Zone. Following the zonal meetings of the ASPAC Zone in 2019 and the AFRAM Zone in 2022, the SVD laity from Europe now met to network and further develop their cooperation with the SVD. The group was welcomed by Fr. Peter Claver Narh, Provincial of the German SVD Province, who also brought greetings from the Zone President Fr. Marek Vanus. The meeting was led by Zonal Coordinator Fr. Franz Helm and Zonal Mission Secretary Fr. Xavier Alangaram, who was responsible for most of the organization. The meeting was characterized by prayers, presentations and discussions. There was still time for a short trip to Cologne Cathedral and a cultural evening with songs and dances from all seven countries plus the Philippines because some participants have their roots there. The highlight was the one-day trip to Steyl, where, in addition to the SVD in St. Michael Mission House, the Blue and Pink Sisters were also visited in their motherhouses.





Presentations about Essential SVD Topics

Thursday and Friday were characterized by lectures followed by an exchange of thoughts and ideas in small groups or in the entire group. General Mission Secretary Fr. Marcelo Cattáneo spoke on "SVD Mission and Lay Partners", Fr. Wojeciech Szypula on "A Symphony of the Word; SVD Lay Partners and the Holy Scriptures", Fr. Franz Helm on "How do we practice our SVD-Charism - JPIC in our life?", Fr. Martin Üffing on "Mission Animation in Europe" and Fr. Xavier Alangaram on "Lay Partner and Fundraising". It became clear in all the presentations and following discussions that this is not about the mission of the SVD or the Church, but about God's mission, his way to people. We can follow and shape this way because we are "gifted to give" by him. The task of God's mission is a common task for all and not a clerical prerogative. It is also implemented "glocally", locally from a global perspective. National differences became clear in the discussions, but above all the participants learnt about the great commitment and wealth of ideas as well as the desire and will to make a difference together for the good of the people.



A Short Trip to Steyl

The group spent the last day together in Steyl, where Fr. Jürgen Ommerborn gave a brief overview of the beginnings in Steyl. He emphasized the important role of the laity in the founding of the mission house and the development of the SVD. He also

celebrated a Holy Mass with the group in the oratory of St. Michael's Mission House at the end of the day. In addition to a guided tour of the house and garden, the group took the opportunity to get to know the motherhouses of the Missionary Sisters and the Adoration Sisters. All the encounters of the day, especially the dialogue with two Adoration Sisters, were an inspiration and motivation for everyone.

"Met - and now what?"

This question was clearly answered in the final discussion before the departure on Sunday: The SVD laypeople will continue to meet at European level, exchange ideas and network. The first meeting will be held online on 10th September 2025. In just a few days, a group was formed that got on well and is travelling in Europe in the spirit of Arnold Janssen and the founding generation.

National Congress

From 21st to 23rd March 2025, the SVD lay partners of the Ghana Province held a congress at the Divine Word Catholic Conference Center in Adoagyiri-Nsawam. The event centered on the theme "The SVD Lay Partners in the Church's Mission," aiming to deepen the understanding of the call and commitment of being a dedicated SVD lay partner.

The congress was organized into three parts. The first featured a speech by Fr. Emmanuel Danso Abeam, who discussed the history of the SVD lay partners and the teachings of St. Arnold Janssen. He highlighted Arnold Janssen's involvement with the "Apostleship of Prayer" and St. Michael's Mission House, stressing the importance of forming lay faithful to help spread the Gospel.

Fr. Abeam reviewed the SVD lay partners' history through General Chapter (GC) documents. The 16^{th} GC acknowledged their appeal to the SVD charism, the 17^{th} as part of the Arnoldus family, the 18^{th} emphasized sharing the charism, and the 19^{th} called for an action plan to support them. The SVD greatly values its lay partners.

Fr. Samuel Adu educated the lay partners on the main theme: the role of the SVD lay partners in the Mission of the Church. He stressed that the mission is of God (Missio Dei) and encouraged lay partners to actively participate in God's mission wherever they may be.



Fr. Titus Tuoyintir shed light on the SVD's trinitarian spirituality and commitment to the Divine Word, highlighting our role as missionaries. The congress was notably enriched by our Provincial, Fr. Cyprian Kuupol, who actively engaged in discussions and clarified points throughout the sessions.

English Class for Kids in Nagekeo

Since May 2025, Soverdia Nagekeo has been running the "English Class of SVD" for children aged 4-13. Held every

The program blends English learning with faith formation, helping children pray in both Indonesian and English while introducing them to the SVD missionary spirit.

Celebrating SVD @ 150

From 22^{nd} to 23^{rd} March 2025, the INE Mission Secretary, in collaboration with the AJSN Coordinator, organized a province-level lay partners' workshop at the SVD Provincial House, Jharsuguda, Odisha. The event focused on the theme: "Celebrating SVD @ 150 – SVD Lay Partners in the INE: Witnessing to the Light."

The workshop opened with scripture, prayer, and a traditional lamp-lighting ceremony. Fr. Anuranjan Bilung, Provincial, gave the keynote on the role of lay partners. Sessions by Fr. Dixson D'Souza, Fr. Eusebius Crasta, and Fr. Rasal Xess, highlighted the biblical, spiritual, and social dimensions of lay involvement in mission, prayer, and JPIC ministries.

A documentary on the Indo-Bangla subzone's 93-year history offered rich insights into SVD contributions across the region. Annual reports shared by participants revealed inspiring stories of lay commitment in action. The program included moments of joyful fellowship, games, and songs led by Sr. Florentina Xess, SSpS.

Rooted in the Word and impelled by the Spirit, the workshop renewed the lay partners' zeal for mission in the spirit of St. Arnold Janssen.

Day-Two Highlights

The second day began with the Eucharist presided over by Fr. Sunil Damor, Vice-Provincial, INE, who encouraged lay partners to respond fruitfully to God's love through lives of renewal and discipleship.

Key sessions included:




A Final Farewell: Candles, Flowers, and the Holy Mass

Basic Bible Seminar at St. Theresa's Church – A Spiritual Awakening

Empowered for Mission: The SLMP DWIMS Journey

The SVD Lay Mission Partners (SLMP) of the Divine Word Institute of Mission Studies (DWIMS) Tagaytay Chapter was originally formed through a formal training program called the Certificate in Mission Studies (CMS). The CMS is a two-year, non-degree program offered by DWIMS for laypeople interested in working with the Church's mission in the context of the New Evangelization.

From Classroom to Mission Field

Upon completing twenty-four units, students receive a Certificate in Mission Studies, which is officially recognized by DWIMS, an institution affiliated with the Royal and Pontifical University of Santo Tomas. Graduates of the CMS who dedicate themselves to ongoing formation with their spiritual director, Fr. Edgar Javier are supported in becoming fully committed members of the SLMP DWIMS Tagaytay Chapter.

The CMS class graduation took place on 24th May 2025, at the Holy Spirit Chapel, Divine Word Seminary in Tagaytay City. On 23rd November 2024, the SLMP DWIMS conducted a medical mission to support the SVD community in Tagaytay and the families of their co-missionaries.

Lay Partners Living the Mission

Additionally, DWIMS alumni contribute to the institute through fundraising activities. With the SVDs, they also participate in celebrations such as Mission Sunday, ordinations, and other gatherings. Furthermore, they initiated a tree planting project at the SVD Laudato Si Farm.

Sharing Christ's Fragrance in Albania



Beginning with the Eucharist

A small group from the SVD parish of S. Benedetto in Rome visited the SVD mission in Albania, accompanied by Fr. Juraj Cibula. From the outset, we noticed that, despite our geographical proximity, we were immersed in a vastly different context. In this area, Christian Catholics are a tiny minority.

Witnessing Love in Action

After attending Mass celebrated by Fr. Sunil Horo, at the church of S. Luigi Gonzaga in Vlorë, we travelled to the village of Babicë. There, we met a group of Alcantarine sisters who work with the local orphanage and welcome the children of the village.

Fr. Gorazd Kohút explained that these children are Muslims, and the main goal of their activities is to teach them human values like gratitude, solidarity, and forgiveness, with evangelization coming only afterward (which is very difficult). The regime and state atheism that existed until a few decades ago, along with the harsh repression of all religions, have left their mark on the population.



The Language of Love

We later visited a local family where we shared smiles, prayers, and experimented with "love is truly the language understood by all people."

Hearts Aflame in Orikum

In Orikum, we spent time at the House of the Sisters of Our Lady of Sorrows, where volunteers entertained children. We spoke with an Albanian woman, one of the few baptized, who said, "We are very few, but we've got fire in our hearts." Her words left a lasting impression on me.

Carrying the Fragrance of Christ

The next day, we travelled south to Saranda, where we observed the stunning coast and felt the truth of the saying: "The harvest is plentiful, but the labourers are few!". Still, our hope in God remains firm.

Even in the most difficult places, even when people are not willing to listen, "we can reach them creatively, with perfume, that good fragrance of Christ".

An Ever-Renewed Commitment to Mission

It was a God-given opportunity to join the SVD Characteristic Dimensions' Coordinators of the AFRAM zone. We met in Kinshasa, D.R. Congo, from 1st to 8th June 2025. The four Generalate coordinators were present, each accompanying their respective partners. I'd like to share a few insights from this enriching experience.

First, it is always an overwhelming experience of diversity, interculturality, and God's given gifts. We do have committed SVD missionaries assigned to different mission stations in this vast continent.

Second, there is a growing understanding of the interconnection and complementarity of the four Dimensions. Since these are family traits of every SVD, not of some specialists, each single ministry, pastoral service, or apostolate must be marked by our being God's Word rooted, witnesses to the Good News, God's mission-oriented, and carers for God's creation.

Third, every participant of the activity realized once more that the present mission challenges urge us to strive for a teamwork mission approach and strategy. Much of our resources (human, pastoral, and material) can be maximized if we walk as testimonial missionary communities.

Fourth, lay partner groups are accompanying the SVD mission in many places, which is a fundamental support for our missionaries who face a series of difficulties in their ministries. Little by little, more groups are emerging, and they are being assisted in terms of purifying their motivations to join the SVD

mission. Without the commitment of the lay people, the mission in Africa would not be possible.

Lastly, our sharing during the four-day meeting left us with a sensation of gratitude to God, for He has made us protagonists in His mission. At the same time, we embrace the need to deepen our conversion and commitment to Jesus' Gospel. Walking and serving our people, we are very much aware of our limitations and lack of a more profound enculturated journey. The path to keep up with our mission as wounded healers is widening our perspective, deepening our spirituality, and letting our lay communities help us.

Walking in Faith: A Lay Partner's Mission in Tripura



A Forest Ranger by Profession, A Missionary by Heart

As a SVD lay partner and member of the Apostles of the Divine Word (ADW), I have been blessed to walk with people in faith and share the Word of God across villages and parishes in Tripura. Though I serve as a Forest Ranger Assistant by profession, my heart beats for mission, especially in conducting retreats, animating Holy Hours, and leading praise and worship. Each experience has brought me closer to God and deeper into the lives of the people I serve.

Proclaiming the Word

On 7th June 2025, I participated in a powerful prayer program at St. Mary's Church, Twikarma Parish, with nearly one hundred parishioners. Fr. Thomas Parara led the Holy Hour, and I shared a Gospel reflection during a day filled with preaching and

worship, alongside my mission team. The response was full of faith and joy.

The rain stopped, God's Word flowed

A week later, on 15th June, we visited Killa Catholic Church in Khumlwng Parish for a retreat. Around thirty people attended. During the session, heavy rain suddenly poured down, drowning out our voices. We paused and prayed with one heart, asking the Lord to help us. In just ten minutes, the rain stopped—a clear sign of God's presence. We continued the program peacefully, and the faithful rejoiced in hearing the Word. "Alleluia! Praise the Lord!"



Mission across villages: One step at a time

Various retreats and village visits occurred in Jampuijala, Bisramganj, Agartala Cathedral, and churches in Kumarghat, Khumlwng, and Twikarma parishes. We visited ten village churches where I led praise sessions, shared the Gospel, and was touched by the people's spiritual hunger.

These experiences have taught me that when we step out in faith, God takes care of the reSt. I may not have formal training or a title, but I carry within me the conviction that I am called to

proclaim Jesus—and I do so with joy. As St. Paul declares, "How beautiful are the feet of those who bring good news!" (Romans 10:15).

Restoring Peace and Unity in Broken Homes in the Highlands of Papua New Guinea

Walking the Path of Suffering and Healing

On 11th March 2025, a rare and significant ceremony of peace and reconciliation happened in Kamboo village of the Gena Tribe in Kerowagi in Simbu Province transcending cultural barriers and promoting unity among different factions of people divided for two decades on issues related to Sorcery Accusation Related Violence (SARV), Gender Based Violence (GBV) and Drug and Substance Abuse.

The event was complemented by the Stations of the Cross, with the actual ceremony happening at the fourteenth station. Affected families and community members walked, carried the cross, and prayed together for the first time before finding peace and reconciling with one another.

"We promised before God, the community, and the very essence of this land that we would never pass on these unfortunate and inhumane stories to our younger generation. We will not speak of sorcery suspicions ever again in our family or community," declared a young leader and local perpetrator. "Please forgive us for we do not know what we've done back then," he said.

Landmark moment of peace in Kamboo village: Forgiveness and hope

The survivors accepted the apologies and came to terms with forgiving them as they looked into a future filled with hope and love.

Themed "Forgive and Forget," the ceremony was led by Diocesan Priest Fr. Christopher Yer Onguglo, the Kendene Parish Priest and Chairman of the St. Christopher Alive Association, which supports drug addicts seeking change. Fr. Christopher collaborates with the Melanesian Institute (operated by SVD religious and lay partners in Goroka) to promote peace and justice in communities.

United in Prayer: The Perpetual Rosary Movement

The Perpetual Rosary Movement (PRM) was born from the deep devotion to Mama Mary shared by former SVD seminarians, inspired by their formation with the SVD fathers at Christ the King Seminary and other SVD

seminaries nationwide. Guided by Spiritual Advisor Fr. Jerry Orbos, the PRM's mission is to keep the Rosary prayed 24/7 across the world—uniting hearts in continuous prayer.

Milestones in Marian Devotion

Since its foundation in 2010, marked by a Rosary Procession and Mass at the Grotto of the Annunciation in Christ the King Seminary, Quezon City, the PRM has inspired thousands through monthly Marian Masses, processions, and grand celebrations like the "Marikit na Ina" Fiesta Mass in Marikina attended by over 2,000 faithful.

From its early days, first conceived as a physical Marian shrine. PRM evolved into a virtual community, first through its website and now through a vibrant Facebook page that connects 5,000 members globally with Marian reflections, updates, and shared devotion.

PRM's mission continues through Life in the Spirit Seminars, First Saturday Marian Celebrations at Christ the King Seminary, and Masses with special Marian processions at the Shrine of the Divine Word. During the pandemic, PRM innovated by offering nightly Rosary prayers via Zoom, fostering unity despite physical distance.


