## First Zonal Meeting of the SVD Lay Partners of the PANAM Zone

Guadalajara (Mexico), September 2025



I greet you all and would like to share a summary of the First Pan-American Assembly of the SVD Lay Partners. The gathering was held at the Nazaret Retreat House in Guadalajara, Mexico, and was officially inaugurated by Fr. Juan Weibel, Provincial Superior of the Mexico Province. A total of 30 lay partners from 16 Provinces and Regions participated, along with nine SVDs, including Fr. Navil D'Silva, PANAM Zone Coordinator. Fr. Marcelo Cattáneo, Generalate Mission Secretary, attended and offered a reflection on the Assembly's guiding theme from Mk 3:13–14:

"He called those whom He wanted, that they might be with  $\operatorname{Him}$  and be sent out to preach."

The assembly began with welcome remarks from the Provincial of Mexico and presentations from the various subzone groups. Formation sessions followed the next day, addressing continental reality, the spirituality and charism of the SVD, faithful and creative discipleship, and Our Lady of Guadalupe as Queen of Evangelization in the Americas. Each topic was presented with depth and creativity, offering rich personal and spiritual insights for all participants.

We shared meaningful moments of prayer led by the various groups. A vibrant cultural evening brought together traditional food, drinks, attire, dances, and songs, celebrating the richness of each country. A group visit to Tequila, Jalisco, strengthened our sense of fraternity and friendship.

A significant highlight of the assembly was the election of the new Zonal Coordinating Team for the SVD Lay Partners.

#### Official Statement and Points of Action

#### Dear Arnoldus Family,

Rooted in the love of the One and Triune God, the participants of the First Meeting of Lay Partners Zone PANAM – September 2025, gathered in Guadalajara, Mexico, want to send you a message of hope, communion, and commitment, inspired by the motto: "He called those he wanted to be with him and to send them out to preach..." (Mk 3:13-19). This call, which we have also received from Jesus, is at the heart of our lay missionary vocation: "Precious is the life given for the mission."

The five subzones of the PANAM Zone participated in this first meeting, accompanied by the General Secretary of Mission, the President of the PANAM Zone, and the Coordinator of the PANAM Zone, as well as some Mission Secretaries; it was an enriching encounter in interculturality, fraternity, and formation, developing: Analysis of the Continental reality, Lay vocation and identity, Spirituality and Charism, Creative disciples and missionaries, and Our Lady of Guadalupe as a model of Evangelization on the Continent.

Jesus lived a spirituality deeply rooted in his intimate and constant relationship with God the Father, always seeking to fulfill His will; thus, we are called to convey, under the guidance of SVD spirituality and charism, our union with Christ through God's mission, of which we are all a part, rekindling hope from a synodal environment.

As lay partners committed to the mission of the Divine Word, we take on the commitment to reach out to our brothers and sisters, being joyful and creative disciples, highlighting the gifts and talents put at the service of God, deepening our lay vocation in the accompaniment of listening, training ourselves as joyful missionaries to respond with responsibility and creativity to the challenges of our time, knowing that the Holy Spirit guides, accompanies, and helps us discern and act according to the will of God.

#### **Action Guidelines Lay Partners PANAM Zone**

- 1. Management and Coordination
- Form coordinating/facilitating teams in each PRM and subzone.
- The coordinating team will seek to maintain fluid communication with the Mission Secretary of the Generalate and the Zonal coordinator.
- Promote financial and legal alternatives for the healthy and integral development of missionary projects according to the reality of each PRM.
- Request support from each PRM for the formation and consolidation of lay partners, always aiming to walk in a synodal manner.
- Collaborate as a team with the Mission Secretary, in the preparation of the Statutes to achieve official recognition from the provincial/regional leaders and their councils.
- 2. Communication
- Organize clear, timely, systematic, and methodological communication channels that allow us to reach every SVD Lay Partner in the PANAM zone.
- Share documents and experiences between PRMs and the PANAM zone.
- 3. Formation
- Establish an annual calendar, virtual or in-person, for training on spirituality, charism, and SVD mission, coordinated by the lay partners' team.
- Study and appropriation of the official documents of the Congregation in all lay partner communities of each PRM.
- Share materials for ongoing formation and promote specialized studies accessible to the laity in the PANAM Zone.
- Encourage instances of prayer, reflection, and sharing of the Word for greater identification with the Divine Word.
- 4. Missionary Pastoral Commitment
- Encourage commitment to collaborate in Youth and Family Pastoral care, thus promoting lay and religious vocations in the PRM.
- Exchange missionary experiences among the provinces of the PANAM zone.
- Strengthen the identity of each group through knowledge of our charism and the joint celebration of the Arnoldus family feasts.

## **Health Camps: Compassion in Action**

## **Health Camp at Ganganagar Mission**

A second camp was held on 2<sup>nd</sup> November, at Ganganagar Mission under Ambassa Parish. Led by the Maria Sanga women's group, it extended the same compassionate service to another community in need. Dr. Asok Debbarma provided dedicated medical care, attending to many patients with kindness.

The camp focused on free check-ups and medicine distribution for poor and marginalized families. With limited healthcare in the area, villagers expressed deep gratitude. The program also encouraged preventive health practices and early medical consultation.

#### Conclusion

Both health camps addressed urgent medical needs while promoting hygiene, prevention, and well-being. They reflect ADW's commitment to holistic care and stand as testimonies of compassionate outreach, bringing hope to the most vulnerable.

## The Philippines (PHC) – The Lay Society of St. Arnold Janssen (LSSAJ)

#### **Rallies and Demonstrations**





Recent revelations of widespread anomalies in Philippine infrastructure projects have cast a shadow over the nation's social, political, and moral life. Many projects remain substandard, unfinished, or entirely "ghost" projects, leaving communities vulnerable to constant flooding. As floods destroy farms and homes, more Filipinos are pushed into poverty and displacement. Exposed by President Marcos, this betrayal of trust reveals a deeper moral decay—where power is used for self-interest instead of the common good.

## The Role of the Church and the Laity

The Church now has a chance to regain moral leadership by awakening conscience and promoting renewal. In its pastoral letter "Beyond Survival: Rising Above the Floods of Corruption", the CBCP calls on Filipinos to reject fraud, demand accountability, and rebuild the nation on truth and justice.

#### Lay Engagement and Civic Action

The CBCP's call inspired and mobilized many lay organizations into action. LSSAJ, committed to social justice and good governance, rallied its members to join the "Trillion Peso"





March" on 21<sup>st</sup> September 2025. Led by Chairman Charlie Avila and President Tony Alvarado, LSSAJ marched alongside youth groups, civil society organizations, church leaders, and a newly awakened sector of the military.

#### **Trillion March**

Young SVD seminarians joined the Trillion March, together with Fr. Erik Lacandula, SVD, Fr. Glenn Paul Gomez, SVD, Fr. Ferdinand Antione Bajao, SVD, and the SSpS sisters. United in purpose, they demanded accountability and an end to corruption, a powerful sign that moral renewal begins when citizens and the Church stand together to defend the common good. Despite differing political beliefs, the event became a rare display of unity among Filipinos, declaring with one voice: Enough is enough. For its part, LSSAJ, in demanding good governance, simply proclaimed anew its message of faith-transforming life.

## **Rally Against Corruption**



In solidarity with the Filipino people who joined the nationwide "Trillion Peso March" protest against massive corruption, the SVD Pindangan Community — together with Mission Partners in San Fernando, La Union — gathered for a series of activities. The protest called for accountability from the government and private individuals believed to have amassed trillions of pesos through irregular flood-control projects.

The activities started with the Eucharistic Celebration at 6:30 a.m., officiated by Fr. Leonardo Hiquiana, SVD, who reminded us about our accountability as God's stewards. SVD-PHN Mission Partner Mary Geraldine Paderon then shared a brief reflection on the community's stand against corruption.

From 1:00 to 4:00 p.m., several SVD-PHN Mission Partners joined the bishop, religious groups, and civic organizations at the San Fernando City Plaza for the protest rally.

Later, at 5:30 p.m., Fr. Rector Emmanuel de Leon, SVD, led a Rosary Walk and Prayer at the SVD Provincialate Compound with the community, retirees, and mission partners. Despite light rain, they continued—raising a humble but firm call: "No to corruption. Stop corruption. We seek accountability and pray for healing in our country".

## 150 Anniversary Celebrations in Madang (SW)

In light of the 150<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the Society of the Divine Word (SVD), Papua New Guinea joined the global celebration with joyful festivities in Madang. Catholic faithful, religious communities, and SVD Friends gathered to mark this milestone, a moment rich in meaning for the nation's faith, history, and people.

### Arrival

The SVD missionaries first arrived in PNG in the late 1800s, bringing not only the message of the Gospel but also a strong commitment to education, health, and community development. Despite facing rough seas, rugged terrain, and unfamiliar cultures, their mission was clear: to walk alongside the people of PNG in faith and friendship.

#### **Education & Health**

SVD missionaries were among the pioneers of schools in remote areas, giving thousands of Papua New Guineans the chance to read, write, and dream of brighter futures. They established clinics and hospitals where there were none, caring for the sick and advocating for better health services long before modern infrastructure reached our villages.



### Faith & Cultures

The missionaries encouraged local languages and traditions in worship, helping shape a local expression of Christianity. They trained local priests and religious leaders, ensuring the Church took root in our own soil. Generally, this celebration is not just about history, but a reminder of how faith, education, and service can transform a nation.

## **Beyond 150 Years**

As the SVD moves beyond 150 years, the focus shifts to strengthening collaboration with lay partners and friends in mission.

In the Diocese of Kundiawa, the Melanesian Institute and JPIC coordinators are working closely with SVD Friends to raise awareness on issues such as substance abuse and gender-based violence. These programs help the SVD Lay Partners understand and live out the Church's social teachings, empowering them to bring faith and justice into their communities.

## **SVD-Partner Meeting in Steyl**





From 2<sup>nd</sup> to 5<sup>th</sup> October, SVD Partner met in Steyl. The meeting was dominated by three themes: looking back, reflection, and making new plans.

### **Looking Back**

2025 was an eventful year for »SVD-Partner«, and not only because of the SVD jubilee. Individual group members took part in the celebrations in 2025 at various locations, such as Pentecost in Steyl, "Steyl Day", and the closing ceremonies in Goch, Sankt Augustin, and St. Wendel. In addition, the group set its own accents with the "Rosary of the Divine Word" and the jubilee novena. #### **Future Plans**

Among the plans forged at the meeting is a social project in 2026. Currently, an initiative in a retirement home or for truck drivers is being examined. As the group is also committed to "Justice, Peace, and Integrity of Creation", it decided to join the ecumenical Netzwerk Eine Erde. The group's goal is also to visit SVD communities and get to know them better. A visit to St. Gabriel in Mödling near Vienna is planned for 2026. This will take place in addition to the three group meetings in Sankt Augustin (1x) and Steyl (2x).

## Journey of Compassion: Feed the Hungry Project of DDW, Andheri



On 8<sup>th</sup> September 2019, a beautiful journey of compassion began with the launch of the Feed the Hungry program. What began as a simple effort to give a few lunch packets to the homeless has grown into a meaningful weekly mission of service and love. Thanks to your support, every Saturday, members and volunteers step out with smiles, bringing not just hot meals but a sense of belonging and hope to those in need.

Even during the COVID-19 pandemic, when many faced immense challenges, the team adapted to provide essentials and groceries, ensuring no one was forgotten. This resilience and adaptability inspire hope and show that even in the darkest times, love and service can prevail.

One of the most touching aspects of this mission is the recipients' humble gratitude – often asking to share with others – reminds us of the power of community, empathy, and service. Their selflessness, despite their own struggles, is a poignant reminder of the power of community and empathy.

## **Climate Change Mitigation & Poverty Alleviation Advocacies**

On 29 October 2025, the Confederation of Coconut Farmers' Organization of the Philippines (CCPOF-COCOFED), led by Charles Avila and Mayette Tamondong of The Lay Society of St. Arnold Janssen, Inc. (LSSAJ), inked an accord with the world-famous rapper of "Black Eyed Peas", the Filipino American Allan Pineda Lindo of Angeles, Pampanga (APL de AP).

The accord aims to build resilient and sustainable coconut farming communities through inclusive climate initiatives. Both parties agreed to co-develop a regenerative coconut-based agroforestry project that will also generate high-quality carbon credits under the Paris Agreement's Article 6.4 mechanism.

APL's group, OMTSE Ventures Inc., will provide technology and handle carbon trading, while CONFED will represent farmers and implement the Carbon Optimization in Coconut-Based Agricultural Landscapes (COCAL) program.

Coconut lands make up 26% of Philippine agricultural land—about 3.7 million hectares – with 2.9 million farmers and workers organized under CONFED and partner groups like PRRM. These lands produce nearly 15 billion coconuts each year, yet most farmers remain poor due to long-standing injustices.

Inspired by Ban Ki-moon's "Green New Deal," CONFED now focuses on reducing emissions and ending poverty in the coconut sector. It aims to capture 522 million metric tons of carbon dioxide over the next decade—the largest goal among all sectors.



Even before meeting CONFED adviser Charles Avila, APL had purchased 1,000 copies of The Philippine Coconut Story, a book co-authored by Avila and Edicio dela Torre, to distribute among his network.

## A Visit to the Tomb of St. Arnold Janssen's Patron Saint in Arnoldsweiler

#### 'Do Not Store up Treasures Here on Earth!' (Mt 6:19)

St. Arnold of Arnoldsweiler took Jesus' call to heart, as a glance at his life story shows: Arnold was a musician at the court of Charlemagne and came with the king to Ginnizweiler (today Arnoldsweiler, Düren, Germany) in 779. He saw the people's need and asked the king for as much forest as he could ride around during the royal hunting banquet. Charlemagne agreed, and Arnold rode around the 'Bürgewald' forest. He then allowed the people living in the 20 villages within it to take wood from the forest. This was made official by a resolution of the Imperial Diet in Düren. Arnold later became an educator to Charlemagne's son, Louis, and ruled the sub-kingdom of Aquitaine (south-western France) until Louis came of age. He finally gave his property to Aniane Abbey (France) and returned to Ginnizweiler, where he died on 18th July 793 and was buried.

Arnold was soon venerated as a saint, and Ginnizweiler became Arnoldsweiler, where his grave can still be found today in the Arnoldus Chapel. Although the Archbishop of Cologne canonised him around 820, he was not included in any official calendar of saints. It was not until a decree by Pope Leo XIII in 1886 that this changed.

Being a musician, Arnold of Arnoldsweiler is always shown with a harp. He is also leaning on it in the painting that St. Arnold Janssen donated to the chapel in Arnoldsweiler in 1889. Painted by Hugo Kohl from Roermond, it shows the legend of the ride around the 'Bürgewald' forest. Incidentally, this forest was not cleared for centuries. It was only destroyed for the most part by open-cast lignite mining.

The donation of the painting suggests that St. Arnold Janssen had a close connection to his patron saint. How did the donation come about? This question still needs to be answered by the SVD archives. However, SVD did have a connection to this saint, at least for a time: parts of the head relic were kept in the church of the mission house in Neuenkirchen-St. Arnold near Steinfurt, Germany.

The Arnoldus Chapel in Arnoldsweiler is worth a visit, and not only because of the painting donated by Arnold Janssen. It is a jewel that was painted in the 20<sup>th</sup> century by the artist Peter Hecker with scenes from the life of the saint and his veneration. The annexed memorial chapel, also designed by him, is equally impressive.




