Jesus is inviting us to make our home in him, to truly enter in to all he is, and all he has for us. Accepting this invitation, helps us to continue the living narrative, where the love of God manifests in our lives for our brothers and sisters, and the whole of creation.

Our Advent waiting prepares us for all the joys and wonders that await us if we open our doors to the Saviour. "Joy to the World, the Lord is Come!" Merry Christmas and have a blessed New Year!

Baptized and sent: The Church of Christ on Mission in the World

Extraordinary Missionary Month October 2019

Every October is a missionary month with World Mission Sunday on the penultimate Sunday or in Germany on the fourth Sunday in October, but for 2019 Pope Francis had called for an Extraordinary Missionary Month and had put it under the motto "Baptized and Sent: the Church of Christ on Mission in the World". With this motto the Pope made clear that mission

is not bound to ordained ministries or religious vows, but the task of every Christian. So it was a matter of course for the SVD Lay Partners to intensify their activities this month. A small selection of reports of the diverse, worldwide activities is the main topic of this newsletter.

Indonesia (IDJ)

SOVERDIA - Activities during Extraordinary Missionary Month



Extraordinary Missionary Month in Indonesia - Java Province was celebrated in every SVD Parish with various activities, to encourage people to be actively involved in the SVD mission works. SOVERDIA, as SVD Lay Partners group, collaborated with the Province endeavors in their missionary activities.

SOVERDIA Bali-Lombok District celebrated the Extraordinary Mission Month by celebrating special Holy Mass and distributing fundraising envelopes for SVD mission work. This



event was held in all SVD Parishes - on October 22, 2019 at Jesus the Good Shepherd Parish and on 26 and 27 October, at St. Joseph's Parish. The Bali-Lombok District fundraising collected total funds of around IDR 235.000.000 (US\$ 20,000).

SOVERDIA Jakarta District also celebrated the Extraordinary Mission Month by celebrating special Holy Mass on a Sunday followed by a fundraising bazaar for the SVD mission work.

SOVERDIA Surabaya District celebrated the Extraordinary Mission Month with special Holy Mass during the first weekend, October 5 and 6, 2019 at the Holy Spirit Parish, Surabaya. After the Mass there was Mission Expo and Seminar. There was also an entertainment programme organized by the Arnold Janssen Family (priests, brothers, sisters and seminarians).

Soon to be SOVERDIA of West Kalimantan District, also celebrated Extraordinary Mission Month with a special Holy Mass. They invited children to dress like priests and nuns, to promote for Jesus' mission in the world. This activity was centered at the Tayan Parish. This was followed by Mission Expo and Mission Talk Shows.

Disciples of the Divine Word (DDW) - Celebrating the Extraordinary Missionary Month



The initiative of Pope Francis to celebrate the month of October 2019 as the Extraordinary Missionary Month aims to awaken the awareness of the meaning of mission and reinvigorate the sense of responsibility for proclaiming the Gospel with new enthusiasm. The theme chosen for the month was "Baptized and Sent: The Church of Christ on Mission in the World."

To bring awareness of what it means to be **baptized and sent**, Sacred Heart Parish, Mumbai invited the Divine Word Missionaries from different Indian Provinces during this month. SVD Lay Partners from the Parish collaborated in this Parish project.

The Fathers arrived from India Mumbai (INM), Eastern (INE), Central (INC) Provinces and India Guwahati Region (ING). They shared with the parishioners their missionary life experience during all Masses, on all the 4 weekends of October. They brought along with them artefacts, handwoven fabric, and things crafted by villagers and tribal people. All items were sold out, thus showing our solidarity towards the mission of Christ.



Amid tough challenges and opportunities, Divine Word Missionaries are engaged in education, health care, socio-economic development, welfare programs for women and children, evangelization and many more, in some of the remote tribal and poor villages in India.

The young missionary group of Friends of SVD performed a drama at the launching, with the song "Baptized and Sent" composed by the Mission Secretary, Fr. Stephen Dogodzi, SVD.

Mission animation

In preparation for the Extraordinary Missionary Month, the National President of the Lay Partners, Madam Helen Dzikunu and the Mission Secretary, Fr. Stephen Dogodzi, SVD visited the Holy Trinity Church in Kintampo to animate people who wish to become SVD Lay Partners. This was made possible through the effort of Fr. Gregory Boss, SVD.

They visited the Formation Houses in Tamale and addressed the seminarians about SVD Lay Partners and Extraordinary Missionary Month activities. They taught them a song for the mission month. A video clip prepared during orientation programme was used to advertise the celebration.

The SSPS led by Sr. Mary Nyako, SSPS, were invited to share with the congregation their vocation and mission, wherein they sold some items produced in their convent to support their mission.

At Christ the King Parish, the Lay Partners sold stationeries and a book written by Fr. Gabriel Sosu, SVD, a Ghanaian missionary working in Zimbabwe. Proceeds from the sale will support his mission in Zimbabwe.

Angola (ANG)

Associação de Leigos Missionários do Verbo Divino - Activities during the Extraordinary Mission Month



The *Associação de Leigos Missionários do Verbo Divino* in Angola undertook various activities to mark the special occasion of the Extraordinary Missionary Month declared by Pope Francis for October 2019. The occasion, carried out in two phases, involved mainly spiritual, formative, recreational and charitable activities.

In September, the Association participated in the celebration of the 145th anniversary of the foundation of the congregation and the 25th priestly anniversary of Fr. Kaike Chivanja, SVD and Fr. José Luis Rodríguez Lopez, SVD.

In October, the association marked the mission month with mission animation activities, with the aim of bringing together lay partners and associates, to reflect on the message of the mission month: "Baptized and sent: The Church of Christ on mission in the world". Also, to share their experiences and create favourable conditions of dynamism that would render the lay associations active in 5 parishes, administered by the congregation in the Archdiocese of Luanda.

On October 13th, the celebration was opened with a theme: The lay faithful as the instrument of the continuation of the mission of Christ on earth facilitated by brother Fernando Castelo, an ex-seminarian. On October 19th, with the help of extraordinary ministers of the Eucharist, members visited 13 bed-ridden old and sick people and held short outdoor recreational activities. On the 20th, we participated in the Pontifical-Mass of Mission Sunday in the Diocese of Viana. And on Octo-



ber 26-27, we organized our first gathering, during which we reflected on the main theme of Mission Sunday, having SVD Deacon, Rev. Garcia de Sousa Kiangala, as the facilitator.

Fr. Kaike Chivanja, SVD with the support of two novices took us through the history and challenges of the congregation in Angola, with the input on the identity and mission of the lay faithful, the family as the domestic Church. Missionary rosary was presented by our brother José Miguel, SVD lay partner and Octavio, a speaker from the IAM Movement and the Young Missionary League.

The climax of the celebration was the Eucharistic celebration presided over by Fr. Daniel Fernando Zoza, SVD, Assistant Priest, *Santa Madalena Church*. More than 53 lay associates and members of IAM Movement and the Young Missionary League took part in the activities.

The column „God and the World“

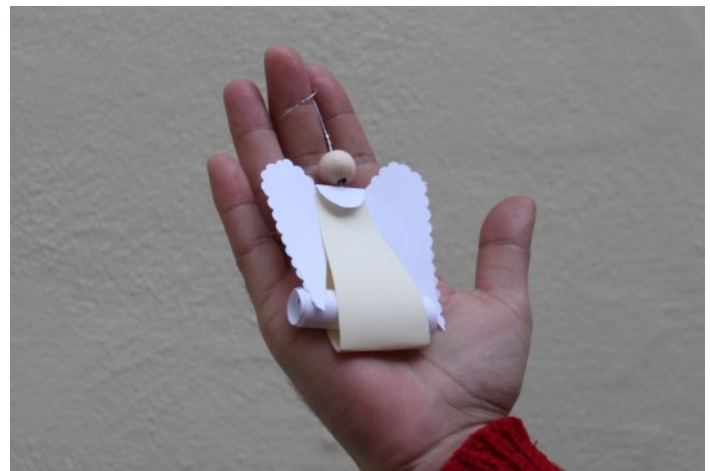

Friends of SVD – Relationship of SVD and Lay Partners in Tanzania

We all value friendship and our lives become more meaningful with the friends. It is rightly said, “Tell me who are your friends, and I will tell you what kind of person you are”. The digital and internet platform like Facebook, WhatsApp, Twitter, Instagram etc. have helped us to reconnect with many of our old friends.

SVD missionaries arrived in Tanzania in the year 2000, with the invitation of Late Bishop Lukanima. SVDs assumed the responsibilities of administering in different Parishes and currently are working in 5 Parishes in Archdiocese of Arusha.

In 2013, Fr. Peddy Castelino, SVD and Fr. Michael Taneo, SVD dreamt of having Lay Partners for this mission. After gathering the information from Kenya and other countries as to how these lay groups work, we worked together on the criteria for membership. Almost all the families we approached were willing to become members. We began with basic orientation and formation, and also worked on the Statutes. We

named the group *Friends of SVD*. The group has leadership team at Parish and National level.

The *Friends of SVD* meet every month on third Monday in the homes of members. Once in three months, the members from all Parishes come together in one Parish for prayer. They have a yearly membership contribution. New members are commissioned after a period of formation. When there is a death in a family, members contribute to support the family. They travel to Parishes in the rural mission to support the Parish and to strengthen the people in faith.

At present The *Friends of SVD* in Tanzania have 55 families as members. They live SVD spirituality and charism, and support our mission with their prayers. Every day they pray for SVD missionaries. They are great and significant partners in our mission.

Democratic Republic of Congo (CNG)

Fraternité SVD - I Faced with a Silence like that of a Cemetery...



It has been more than 11 years since I started working for children's right to education in western Democratic Republic of the Congo (DRC). Even though the challenges in this part of the country are immense, nothing could disrupt my work. However, in December 2017, the Kasai region plunged into a terrible, deadly crisis of great magnitude and untold violence that forced tens of thousands of people, including children, to flee into neighbouring areas.

Education is crucial because it allows children to look toward the future, especially in the context of crisis. Faced with the mass arrival of displaced children in the Kwilu province, we started establishing emergency programs. More than 10,000 displaced children found school benches again and more than half of them received psychosocial support.

At the end of 2018, the situation for children and women newly settled in the Kwilu province began to improve, but for those who found refuge in the Maï-Ndombe province, this was not the case ... deadly clashes had transformed the city of Yumbi into a ghost town.

I was part of the first team deployed to the location to evaluate the humanitarian situation. When we arrived there, we



were faced with a silence like that of a cemetery - not the slightest sign of life, not a single noise, not even the call of a bird. The desolation was absolute. Everything was destroyed and burned. It was like the sun had ceased to shed light on life at Yumbi.

With our partners, the UNICEF emergency team provided school kits to more than 6,000 students and provided tents and benches to 17 schools, that were destroyed during the clashes so that they could function again. We further provided teacher-training, and psychosocial support to tens of thousands of children.

UNICEF supports safe spaces for learning and play for children affected by the crisis in Yumbi. For children in emergency situations, education represents a real lifeline. Education cannot wait!

It was no coincidence that the foundation day of the Society of the Divine Word was also the feast of the Nativity of Mary. Saint Arnold Janssen, in his personal devotion, recognized Mary as the chosen one: "She is our model of faithful attentiveness and ready response to God's word; she will help us to bring the Divine Word to others". On this welcome note, we launched our new project "Feed the Hungry" on September 08, 2019 at Atma-Darshan on the 144th Anniversary of SVD Foundation Day.

The colours white, blue, red, green and yellow, used for launching this project and they were meant to remind us of our missionary calling. They stand for diversity and interculturality. At a global level, they represent the continents where the SVDs work. At our own micro level, they represent all of us who are from different ethnic, cultural, linguistic and lifestyle backgrounds.



Our belief is very simple: cooking a little extra food in our homes and move in small groups to feed the hungry. A smile, a conversation, a simple hot meal is enough to make a difference in someone's day. We see them every day. Around street corners, at traffic signals, in the slums and in the neighbourhood. Sometimes, it is the battered face of an old woman, it is the tired eyes of people outside hospitals, a bunch of street children eager for a meal, we meet them all. When we meet them and listen to their struggles, we are convinced that God is with them. It gives us an opportunity to encounter God and to be faithful to the Gospel values.

In the short span of two months, a simple idea has gained immense acceptance. It is the combined efforts of our little actions that will lead to a world where this goal becomes possible.

St. Joseph Freinademetz Musical Film Honored in Poland



Produced by SVD Hong Kong & Macau, musical film "St. Joseph Freinademetz - The First Saint to Ever Serve in Hong Kong" received 2nd Prize of the "Best TV and Multimedia Program" award at the 34th International Catholic Film and Multimedia Festival "KSF Niepokalana 2019" in Warsaw, Poland. On September 22, 2019, Dr. Anthony Cheng, the film's music director, attended festival's closing ceremony and accepted the award on behalf of SVD and our film crew of 180 people at the Cathedral of St. Michael the Archangel and St. Florian the Martyr, a historic landmark in eastern Warsaw. This is the film's second award after being named "Honorable Mention" in 2019 Gabriel Awards organized by the United States and Canada Catholic Press Association in June.

Fr. Joseph Lei-Tao Tan, SVD, the producer of the film, said "We are very happy to have received this honor and would like to share our happiness with every SVD. With subtitled versions of over 15 languages, now we are more confident to share this musical film with the whole world. Indeed, our act-



ing team was mostly made up of beginning actors and actresses. 95 percent of them were performing for the first time. As this is a staged musical recording, they had no opportunity to retake scenes. Completing a musical at this level, on the first try, with so little experience, is truly a miracle from the Lord. Also, most of our crew learnt about the St. Joseph Freinademetz through participating in this project, as his story in China really touched many of their hearts. Therefore, I hope this film can be screened in many more countries, so that people around the world can have the opportunity to understand the importance of evangelization."

These visits are very meaningful for the seminarians because they feel cared for and loved. We believe, that our visit also strengthens them to live their vocation faithfully till the time of their ordination.

First Meeting of SOVERDIA IDJ (Indonesia-Java) Province

For the first time, SOVERDIA IDJ Province meeting was held with the participation of representatives from, the Tenggara-rong District, Surabaya District, Jakarta District and Bali-Lombok District. This meeting was intended to foster fraternity and fellowship among SVD Lay Partners. On this occasion, Fr. Hendrikus Meko, SVD gave the members guidance, and encouraged us to continue to support SVD mission work



worldwide. While we sang the hymn of SOVERDIA, we felt such meetings are fulfilling and can mutually strengthen SOVERDIA members.

Opening and Closing Mass of the Rosary Month at the Kerobokan – Bali Prison

In order to answer the spiritual longing of Catholic prisoners in the Kerobokan-Bali prison, we visited the prison and had Masses during the Rosary Month. On October 1, 2019 the Mass was celebrated by Fr. Paskalis Widastra, SVD along with the recitation of the rosary in the Maria Cave, located next to the Chapel in the prison. The closing Mass was on October 31, 2019, celebrated by Fr. Yosef Wora, SVD. We also donated devotional prayer books and rosaries.

Currently we are also working on a 'special project' so that we can distribute Holy Communion once a week and also hold a "Receive the Sacrament of Penance" for this coming Advent.

SOVERDIA - St. Mikael Parish, Kranji - West Java, Jakarta District



Brief history

On September 24, 2000, SOVERDIA was formed at St. Mikael, Kranji Parish by the initiative of Fr. Damianus Weru, SVD who was then the Parish Priest, and was inaugurated by Fr. Bien Prado, SVD. Currently, we are 24 members of SOVERDIA, Kranji. Of the five SVD Parishes in Jakarta District, 3 Parishes have SOVERDIA community, St. Arnoldus - Bekasi, St. Mikael - Kranji, West Bekasi and St. Bartolomeus - Taman Galaxi, South Bekasi.

Activities and mission work

Every first and third Tuesdays of the month, we gather together to pray and participate in the Adoration and Holy Eucharist. We work with other prayer groups and take part in the Parish Liturgical services. We also collect coins and donate to SVD missions. Savings from generous donations from members is used to ease recreational activities or spiritual pilgrimage. Some of our activities –

- › Decent used clothes sold during mission weeks and proceeds donated to SVD Seminaries. Provided food for flood victims.
- › Visited Lawang Uru and Tumbang Mahuroi, Kuala Kurun in Palangkaraya, with SOVERDIA Central Kalimantan to discuss renovation of the Chapel at Lawang uru and construction of the Chapel at Mahuroi station. Visited Bali Wacana SVD Monastery - Denpasar and homes of SVDs in Palasari - Bali, Dharma Wacana Monastery, Yogyakarta and Simeon Hannah Monastery, Jakarta.



- › Donated funds for implementation of Faith of Men and Women of the Legion of Maria, St. Hilarius Parish, Batam. Procured transport to one of the Parishes in Atambua, East Timor border.
- › Assisted with a laptop to one of the lecturers in Malang Seminary and a Projector to Long Bentuk Parish.
- › Donated funds for the construction of St. Maria Parish Cave Markus, Melak-Samarinda, and for Altar renovation and Grotto in Sanggau - West Kalimantan Parish.
- › Support to priests who work overseas.
